





Places of Interest



NATIONAL SCIENCE CENTRE

Housed in a futuristic looking building, the National Science Centre has various galleries that promote the understanding of Science and Technology. ISTANA NEGARA (NATIONAL PALACE) Jalan Duta

Istana Negara or the National Palace is the official residence of the King of Malaysia. This majestic edifice at Jalan Duta officially became the National Palace in 2011, replacing the old palace in Jalan Istana. Covering 97.65 hectares, the palace boasts a traditional Malay design with Islamic art work that were created by renowned sculptors from Terengganu and Kelantan. The palace is graced by 22 domes, with the largest standing at 44



TUGU NEGARA (NATIONAL MONUMENT) Jalan Parlimen

LITTLE INDIA @ BRICKFIELDS

Situated overlooking the KL Lake Gardens, the huge bronze monument was built to pay tribute to the soldiers who gave their lives defending the country during the Communist Insurgency in the 1950s. The National Monument was designed by Felix de Weldon, the architect of the famous Iwo Jima Memorial.




Shopping

Kuala Lumpur is a paradise for shoppers with something to cater to every taste and budget. The BBKLCC zone, made up of Bukit Bintang and KLCC is the city's main shopping area. There are numerous other chic malls around the city such as Mid Valley Mega Mall and The Gardens, Quill City Mall, Nu Sentral and Berjaya Times Square. For those who want a different shopping experience, there are places like Pasar Seni, Jalan Tunku Abdul Rahman and Petaling Street, offering a mind-boggling range of items.





Dining



Kuala Lumpur is hailed as the region's food capital for its delectable variety of food and availability of 24-hour restaurants. Be it for enjoying a lavish meal at exclusive restaurants or chilling out at the alfresco cafes, KL offers unbeatable dining experiences. Getting There

KL is easily accessible by air, sea and land. The main airport in the country is the Kuala Lumpur International Airport which is about one hour's drive from the city. It is complemented by the newly built KLIA2, the world's largest purpose-built terminal dedicated to low cost carriers. The national carrier Malaysia Airlines has a global network that spans six continents. Malaysia Airlines is complemented by its subsidiary Firefly and the budget airline

From the airport, visitors can take the KLIA Ekspres and KLIA Transit fast trains for a hassle-free journey to the city. Buses, taxis and car rental services are also available.

Getting Around

Getting around the city is convenient with the network of trains and buses. KL Sentral Station is the city's modern transportation hub. The services here include KLIA Ekspres/Transit, LRT, KL Monorail and KTM Komuter trains. In addition, visitors can also get around via the KL Hop On Hop Off Bus Tours. Trams are available within the Tun Abdul Razak Heritage Park area.

PERDANA BOTANICAL GARDENS

A refreshing oasis of greenery, Perdana Botanical Gardens is the city's premier park, sprawling over 200 acres. This tropical garden features exotic blooms, luxuriant foliage, impressive sculptures and majestic trees. Visitors can enjoy a stroll along the lake, go boating or put their stamina to the test at the jogging trails.



KL BIRD PARK

Sprawling over 20.9 acres, the KL Bird Park houses more than 3,000 birds from 200 local and foreign species. KL Bird Park is reputed to be the world's largest free-flight walk-in aviary. This beautifully landscaped park is home to the Changeable-Hawk Eagle, Bird of Paradise and many more. After a visit, enjoy a meal at the Hornbill Restaurant and Café, built in the style of a traditional Malay house.

NATIONAL MUSEUM Jalan Damansara

MASJID JAMEK Off Jalan Tun Perak

birthplace of Kuala Lumpur.

Malaysia's premier museum serves as a repository for the nation's rich history and heritage. Built in 1963, the museum's façade features a Minangkabau-style roof with two impressive front murals. The museum has four main galleries, showcasing a collection of keris or the Malay dagger, musical instruments, ceramics and many other artefacts. The museum offers free guided tours in various languages at 10.00am. www.muziumnegara.gov.my



This museum showcases the beauty of Islamic arts in Malaysia and around the world. Highlights include Islamic architecture and replicas of famous buildings such as the Taj Mahal in India, Masjid Al-Haram in Mekah and the Amir Timur Mausoleum in Uzbekistan.



This is the main mosque in the city, boasting a star-shaped dome and a 73 metre high minaret. The beautifully landscaped grounds are dotted with pools and fountains. The mosque is situated at the fringes of the Perdana Lake Gardens. Visitors are advised to dress modestly when visiting the mosque and avoid prayer times.



PASAR SENI (CENTRAL MARKET) **Jalan Hang Kasturi**

Pasar Seni or Central Market is an award-winning bazaar which offers a wide variety of souvenirs and crafts created by local artists. Hunt for Malay, Chinese or Indian inspired souvenirs or find excellent pieces that reflect the traditions of the ethnic groups in Sabah and Sarawak. Designed by architect and designer TY Lee, this building is a fine example of the Art Deco styles of the 1930s. It was the first example of a heritage building being adapted for

a different use. www.centralmarket.com.my



This Indian enclave has various social, cultural, educational and

religious establishments. Among the unique landmarks here

are the Vivekananda Ashrama Building which was constructed

in 1904, the YMCA building founded in 1905, old shophouses,

schools, temples, churches, a mosque and a Chinese temple.

SRI MAHA MARIAMMAN TEMPLE Jalan Tun H.S. Lee

Situated at Jalan Tun HS Lee, this temple is one of the oldest in the country. The strikingly beautiful temple has a 22 metre tower and its interior is adorned with paintings and scuptures that depict the Hindu deities. During the festival of Thaipusam, this temple is the starting point of the procession that leads to Batu Caves.



A fine example of early English Gothic architecture, this cathedral

features stained glass windows and tasseled tile paving. A unique

feature here is the pipe organ built in 1895 by Henry Wills, one of

the greatest organ builders of his day.

Petaling Street or Chinatown is the place to find everything from novelty items, fresh flowers, clothes, bags, shoes to timepieces and many more. Genuine, adventurous visitors can put their bargaining skills to the test.



Sultan Abdul Samad Building one of the city's most enduring

attractions. Built in 1897, the building is said to have been the

finest in the Malay states. It features an imposing porch, graceful

horseshoe shaped arches, shiny copper domes and a 41.2 metre

clock tower. The Ground Floor of this building houses a Tourist

Junction of Lebuh Pudu and Jalan Tun H.S. Lee

This temple has a history dating back to 1864. It was built by Yap Ah Loy, one of the most prominent leaders of the early Chinese community. Sze Ya Temple pays tribute to the deities of Sin Sze Ya and Si Sze Ya, which were said to have guided the Chinese Kapitan during the Selangor Civil War.



DATARAN MERDEKA (MERDEKA SQUARE)

Dataran Merdeka is one of the most important heritage sites in

the city. The Union Jack was lowered here to mark the country's

independence from Colonial rule. Hence the name Dataran

Merdeka, which means 'Independence Square'. Activities in the

area include free heritage guided walks, and KL ByCycle tours.

KL OLD RAILWAY STATION Jalan Sultan Hishamuddi

This splendid building was the hub for the nation's rail transportation system before the state-of-the-art KL Sentral Station was built. Its Moorish architecture with graceful arches and minarets makes it one of the city's most photographed



Built in 1909, Masjid Jamek is the city's oldest surviving mosque.

It features design elements that are inspired by the Mogul

architecture in Northern India. Cupolas and minarets top the brick

walls and arched colonnades, while a 70 feet dome surmounts

the prayer hall. This mosque occupies a historic location at

the confluence of the Klang and Gombak rivers, which is the

MUZIUM DIRAJA (ROYAL MUSEUM) Jalan Istana

This museum is housed in a building that was formerly the National Palace. It was opened to the public after the official residence of the King was moved to Jalan Duta. Visitors can browse through the royal regalia and gifts during exhibitions.

KL City Gallery gives an overview of the city's past, present and

Jalan Punchak, Off Jalan P.Ramlee

Standing at a height of 421 metres, KL Tower is one of the most prominent landmarks in the country. It is the seventh tallest telecommunications tower in the world and the tallest in Southeast Asia. The tower is situated in the Bukit Nanas Forest Reserve, making it the only tower in the world to be located within a forest. View the city skyline from a dizzying height of 276 metres at the Observation Deck and enjoy a variety of other activities.

JALAN-JALAN @ KAMPONG BHARU

Kampong Bharu exudes a distinctive Malay identity with traditional wooden houses, mosques, street stalls, old trades and eateries. The area has been occupied by the close-knit community that retained their heritage and traditions for generations. Don't miss the signature delicacies such as Ikan Bakar (grilled fish) and Nasi Lemak Antarabangsa. Free guided walks are held on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays at 4.15pm.



MALAYSIA TOURISM CENTRE (MATIC) Jalan Ampang

Set in a colonial building, MATIC is a one-stop centre for tourists. Enjoy a host of facilities such as a 24-hour tourist police counter, Internet access, tour agencies, currency exchange, hotel reservations as well as souvenir outlets and a chocolate boutique. Constructed in 1935, MATIC was originally a family residence of a wealthy tin miner and rubber estate tycoon. The building has been the venue of several important occasions including the first

Standing at a height of 451.9 metres, this gleaming structure of steel and glass is one of the world's tallest buildings. It is the centre piece of the Kuala Lumpur City Centre or KLCC, a prime attraction consisting of the Suria KLCC Shopping Mall, star-rated hotels, a landscaped park and a convention centre. Enjoy the exhilaration of standing at the Skybridge on the 41st Floor and Viewing Deck on the 86th Floor. Admission is on a first-come-first-serve basis. Jalan Stonor

The Heritage Centre offers an insight into Malaysia's built heritage through exhibitions and seminars. Within its grounds is the Rumah Penghulu Abu Seman, a fine example of a traditional Malay house. Originally the residence of a Malay headman, the house was restored and transported from the northern state of Kedah.
