Langkawi comprises a group of 99 tropical islands lying off the northwestern coast of Peninsular Malaysia, about 30 km from Kuala Perlis and 51 km from Kuala Kedah on the mainland. The main island is known as Pulau Langkawi. The islands are shrouded with an intriguing heritage of myths and legends that feature ogres and gigantic birds, warriors and fairy princesses, battles and romance.

Langkawi has been accorded the Global Geopark status by UNESCO, for its beautiful geological heritage of stunning landscapes, karsts, caves, sea-arches, stacks, glacial dropstones and fossils. With a geological history dating back 550 million odd years, the islands contain unique rock formations that stir the imagination and baffle the mind.

The clear emerald waters around the islands are perfect for a host of water sports and recreational activities. The enchanting marine life beneath the waters of Langkawi beckons diving onthwisests.

Your First Stop Kuah

Kuah is located on the southeastern tip of Langkawi and is the island's main town with Kuah Jetty being the take-off point to the Peninsular Malaysia mainland, Penang and neighbouring country Thailand. The name Kuah is a Malay word meaning 'gravy', referring to an ancient folklore of two battling giants who overturned a gigantic pot of curry at the spot where the town now stands.

Once a rustic town with a few streets, present-day Kuah is a thriving centre of hotels and shopping-cum-business complexes, fortunately without the din of modern-day cities. Kuah offers a wide variety of duty-free goods such as tobacco, liquor, cosmetics and electrical items at highly-attractive prices.

EAGLE SQUARE or Dataran Lang is Langkawi's most prominent landmark for visitors arriving via the sea. Situated near the Kuah Jetty, the main attraction of the square is the magnificent statue of the reddish brown eagle majestically poised for flight. According to local folklore, Langkawi derived its name from the eagle or *helang*. In old Malay, kawi denotes reddish brown, hence Langkawi means 'reddish brown eagle'.

The square is beautifully landscaped and features scenic ponds, bridges, covered terraces, restaurants and barrel vaults made of bricks. The square is beautifully illuminated at night and presents a dramatic scene as you approach the island from the sea.







TAMAN LEGENDA OR LEGENDS PARK is a scenic park with beautiful gardens of vivid local blooms, plants and fruit trees. This 50-acre park has been designed and landscaped with exhibits detailing the myths and legends of the island. It houses 17 monuments, each with an intriguing story to tell.






Beaches & Cruising

Nature's Best in Langkawi





PULAU PAYAR MARINE PARK is situated in the northern part of the Straits of Malacca, 19 nautical miles south of Langkawi and encompasses the islands of Pulau Payar, Pulau Lembu, Pulau Segantang and Pulau Kaca. The marine park teems with a fascinating diversity of marine life and vegetation. Pulau Payar is the most popular of the islands as its sheltered waters are ideal for snorkelling, diving and swimming. Among the enchanting dive spots is the Coral Garden, an area covered with bright, multi-hued soft corals.

Visitors can get to Pulau Payar from Kuah Jetty by catamaran or speedboat. The catamaran takes about 45 minutes to get to Pulau Payar while the speedboat takes about an hour. It is advisable to book the catamaran service a day before the trip. An entry fee to the marine park is chargeable. SOUTHEAST ASIA'S FIRST GEOPARK

Langkawi, which has the distinction of being the first geopark in Malaysia and in the region, has many geosites with outstanding sights for visitors. There are three geoforest parks in Langkawi - the Machinchang Cambrian Geoforest Park is reputed to be the oldest geological formation in the country. At the Kilim Karst Geoforest Park, one can view magnificently-formed landscapes from nearly vertical to subrounded karstic hills as well as pinnacles of various shapes and sizes. The Dayang Bunting Marble Geoforest Park boasts fine marbles

LAKE OF THE PREGNANT MAIDEN or Tasik Dayang Bunting, with its uniquely-coined name, is sure to enthrall you with its beautiful surroundings and mysterious past. The name of Langkawi's largest freshwater lake is attributed to the legend of a lovely fairy princess who married an earthly prince. Her first child died shortly after birth. She was so sad and depressed that she buried the child in the crystal clear waters of the lake.


Before she returned to her celestial abode, she blessed the waters so that any childless maiden who bathed in the lake would conceive thereafter. To reach the lake one has to get to the Island of the Pregnant Maiden first and then take a short walk through the forest reserve.

SUNGAI KILIM offers some truly unforgettable sights and experiences for adventurous travellers to Langkawi. A tour that is bound to provide plenty of thrills is the boat cruise to Kilim Karst Geoforest Park, an escapade to another world. Spread over an area of 100 square kilometres, Kilim Nature Park features a beautiful mix of well-protected green mangrove forests, isolated white beaches and blue lagoons.

On the trail, along the calm winding river, you will be exposed to the wonders of the park's marine ecosystem and flora and fauna like the overhanging Bogak Trees, Brown Eagles, Tree Crabs, iguanas and macaques. Enjoy the scenic and spectacular view of unique limestone rock formations emerging from the floor of the mangrove swamps and the sea.





These fascinating geological wonders have been dubbed the Temple of Borobodur, the Elephant Stone and the Hanging Gardens.

THE HOLE IN THE WALL FISH FARM is a 10-minute boat ride from the Kilim river jetty. Try your hand at feeding the tame stingrays at the fish farm. Located in the Kilim mangrove area, which covers about 1,309 hectares, the stingrays are fed half a kg of fish daily.




DURIAN PERANGIN WATERFALLS is suitable for picnics, a relaxing dip and recreation. This 14-tier waterfall, north from Kuah, is truly a sight to behold and is accessible after a short trek through the rainforest.

TEMURUN WATERFALL Located within the Machinchang Geoforest Park near Datai Bay, the Temurun Waterfall is Langkawi's tallest waterfall. This seasonal waterfall is best visited during the monsoon season (September – October) as the water would be reduced to a mere trickle during the dry season. A refreshing respite from the hot and humid weather, this waterfall is clearly visible from the road.

SEVEN WELLS or Telaga Tujuh, located in the northwestern corner of Langkawi, is a geological marvel. The waterfall is so named because the cascading waters are broken by a series of seven natural pools. The lush green forest that surrounds the waterfall adds a mystical touch to the natural splendour. Legend has it that fairies used to come down to the waterfall to bathe and frolic. Waterfall Abseiling is available at the above waterfalls.

CAVES in Langkawi worth exploring include Gua Cherita which is easily accessible and situated only 30 minutes by boat from Tanjung Rhu. Inside are interesting rock formations steeped in fabled tales of mystery and romance. Look out for ancient inscriptions on the walls.

Another interesting cave is Gua Kelawar nestled in the heart of a mangrove forest. A wooden platform allows visitors easy access through the cave. Gua Pasir Dagang, about 45 minutes by boat from Kuah, has a shallow stream running right through the cave. The boat journey to the cave itself is an adventure of sorts. Guides can be engaged for cave expeditions.



Rich Island Culture

LANGKAWI CRAFT COMPLEX is located on the northern coastline of Langkawi in the vicinity of Teluk Yu, about 30 minutes' drive from the airport or 45 minutes from Kuah Town. Nestled on a hillside overlooking the sea, this magnificent complex offers a wide range of Malaysian handicraft such as delicate hand-drawn batik.

ORIENTAL VILLAGE Overlooking beautiful Burau Bay, it is one of the region's most unique shopping, cultural and culinary destinations. Specially designed to provide a new concept in resort duty-free shopping, the Oriental Village also houses fine-themed restaurants, reflecting Asia's culinary delights. Located at Burau Bay, it is a 15-minute drive from the Langkawi International Airport. While the Village is accessible 24-hours, most tenants operate between 10am to 7pm daily.

AIR HANGAT VILLAGE is situated on four acres of land about 14 km north-west of Kuah. This modern complex is constructed around a 3-tier fountain believed to spring out warm curative waters, next to a riverstone mural depicting the legends that enshroud this location. Browse through the souvenir shops and enjoy the cultural performances held here.


Things To Do, Sights To See

Besides the sun, sea and sail factor, there are many activities awaiting you in Langkawi. These include simple jungle treks, guided bird watching outings, kayaking through mangroves and mountain walks. For the more adventurous, there is the Langkawi Canopy Adventures. Thrill-seekers will enjoy the ride of their lives along wire cables strung between tall trees high up in the rainforest canopy. The view from the canopy is simply magnificent. For something different, try horse riding in the pristine rainforests, passing by rubber estates, golf courses and villages. Langkawi Quad Adventure packages are available at Langkawi Cable Car, Lubuk Semilang and Jalan Ulu Melaka, while 4x4 Fun Ride packages are available at Tanjung Rhu. Horse riding along the beach and watersports activities particularly along Pantai Cenang and Pantai Tanjung Rhu are also available.



GALERIA PERDANA about 11 km from Kuah, houses an impressive collection of over 2,500 state gifts and awards presented to the former Prime Minister of Malaysia Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad and his wife Tun Dr Siti Hasmah bt Mohd Ali. The exhibits at the gallery include crystalware and gifts fashioned out of wood, leather, silver, copper, pewter, ceramics and glass. There are also musical instruments, Islamic arts and crafts, textiles and weapons. Be inspired by the intricate Islamic architectural designs which adorn the gallery's ceiling.

LAMAN PADI LANGKAWI highlights the history, heritage and development of paddy cultivation as the oldest agricultural industry in Malaysia. Among the attractions here is a rice museum displaying artefacts, charts and photographs depicting the significance of paddy cultivation in the country. For the uninitiated, try your hand at paddy planting using both traditional and modern methods of cultivation.

There is also a restaurant offering popular traditional Malay recipes and local delicacies, which are prepared using rice as the main ingredient.

KOTA MAHSURI with its fabled and historical past is a significant site on the island that has been preserved for posterity. Located about 12 km from Kuah, this memorial is erected in honour of Mahsuri, a fair maiden who had been unjustly accused of adultery. According to legend, she had bled white blood at her execution as a sign of her innocence. In her dying breath, she laid a curse on the island, declaring that it would remain barren for seven generations. Fact or fiction, seven generations have since passed and today, Langkawi is a flourishing tourist destination. There is also a museum here where tourists can view a recorded interpretation of the Mahsuri legend.



LANGKAWI SKYCAB Enjoy an exhilarating cable car ride to the top of Gunung Mat Chincang. Visitors can enjoy marvellous views of the Andaman Sea and the Langkawi island group, as well as breathtaking sights such as overhanging cliff walls and isolated pinnacles. With a length of 950 m, the Langkawi SkyCab has been recognised as 'The Longest Free Span Single Rope Cable Car' by the Malaysia Book of Records. It also has one of the steepest gradients in the world, at 42°.

At the middle and top stations, walking trails and viewing platforms are available for visitors to further enjoy the panoramic views. Langkawi SkyCab is situated at the Oriental Village in Burau Bay, about 30 minutes away from Kuah town. After the ride, drop by at the Oriental Village to browse through the assortment of souvenirs.

SKY BRIDGE The Longest Free Span and Curved Bridge In The World. Completed in 2004, this suspended bridge is built on top of the Machinchang mountain. Accessible from the Top Station, the bridge is suspended from a 82m high single pylon, hangs at about 100m above ground and it can accommodate up to 250 people at the same time. It swings out over the landscape to give visitors a unique spatial experience, and to bring them into otherwise unattainable locations, above virgin jungle with spectacular views. Notably, in contrast to a straight bridge, where the end is always monotonously in sight, a curved bridge offers spectacularly changing perspective that reinvent themselves, as one proceeds along it.

GO-KART RACING Langkawi's MORAC International Karting Circuit offers visitors the exhilarating go-karting experience on an international standard track. This legendary circuit has played host to many world-class karting events. Equipped with an upgraded computerised timing system, this state-of-the-art circuit offers even more thrills and challenges for go-kart enthusiasts. Located in Padang Matsirat, this pioneering race track also caters for corporate functions.

LANGKAWI SKYTREX ADVENTURE

Langkawi Skytrex Adventure is a tree-to-tree 'sky-trekking' adventure – the first-of-its-kind in Malaysia. Located in the prestigious area of Perdana Quay, it takes visitors on an exciting experience of flying, swinging, gliding and dangling on various aerial obstacles suspended above the lush tropical rainforest. It is set against the dramatic landscape of Gunung Mat Chincang which offers breathtaking views. Langkawi Skytrex Adventure is constructed and managed in accordance with international safety standards while still being environmentally-friendly.

UNDERWATER WORLD LANGKAWI features the island's rich treasure trove of marine life. Located at the popular Cenang Beach, this aquarium features more than 5,000 types of aquatic life, exhibited in more than 100 tanks of different sizes. The highlight is a giant tank housing large marine species such as sharks, stingrays, moray eels and green turtles, with a 15-metre tunnel for visitors to walk through. Watch these magnificent underwater creatures at feeding time.

At the New Wing, visitors have the chance to view the latest additions to the Underwater World - penguins and seals! The penguins include Sub-Antarctic Rockhoppers and include Black-footed species from Africa. The former is fed at 11.30am and 3.30pm, while the latter at 9.30am and 2.30pm. The harbour seals are fed at 11am and 3pm daily. Drop by these hours for a delightful experience! This new facility also has a three-dimensional (3D) theatre that airs informative documentaries on the island's marine life.

LANGKAWI ORCHID FARM Showcasing more than 1,000 orchid species, Langkawi Orchid Farm is the largest-of-its-kind in Malaysia's northern region. The farm showcases hundreds of species including some exotic and rare ones, including the Tiger Orchid, the Dancing Lady and the Antelope Orchid. Guided tours are available to take you around this three-acre farm to appreciate the blooms and learn about their cultivation. The farm also offers an overnight package for schoolchildren to learn about sustainable farming, from organic composting to handson fish farming. A small café that serves cold beverages is also available on site.

FAIZY CRYSTAL GLASS BLOWING STUDIO

Faizy Crystal Glass Blowing Studio is the place for exquisitely handcrafted crystal mementoes. Established in 2002, the craftsmen here use old-fashioned glass-blowing methods to produce a range of delicate art pieces. Visitors will get the opportunity to watch how each piece is created. See how the artisans work in extremely high temperatures by blowing air manually into molten pieces of glass to create various crystal goods.

situated within walking distance from Kuah Jetty is an exclusive establishment with a beautiful clubhouse. There is also a fully-equipped marina comprising 51 berths that can accommodate a variety of vessels including sailing keels, deep hull boats and even 60-metre mega yachts. The Club has extensive facilities which include a waterfront swimming pool, jacuzzi and sauna, deep-sea fishing facilities, sailing facilities, scuba diving facilities, jet-skiing facilities and speedboat facilities, and yacht chartering service. You can hire the Club's luxury motor yacht, Putri Maimunah, for a discovery or sunset tour of

the beautiful Langkawi islands. For diners, RLYC is the perfect place to enjoy a long cool drink and a delightful meal in relaxing surroundings. Breathtaking views of Langkawi's beautiful islands and sunset can be enjoyed from its beachfront restaurant called Charlie's Place or from the Captain's Deck, its fine dining restaurant. 

Live Action on the Island

Langkawi has an excellent reputation as a worldclass venue for international sporting events. Be one of the thousands of participants and spectators who drop by yearly to catch these pulsating events, live!

The Langkawi International Maritime and Aerospace Exhibition (LIMA) is held in Langkawi every two years. The main attractions of this event are the high-tech military hardware and equipment on display. The exhibition is usually held in March and goes on for a week. 

Getting to Langkawi

By Road

Visitors travelling by road have to drive to Kuala Kedah or Kuala Perlis on the north-western coast of Peninsular Malaysia, the main take-off points by ferry to Langkawi. The journey from Kuala Lumpur to Kuala Kedah takes about six hours while Kuala Perlis is an additional hour away. Car parking facilities are available at both jetties.

By Air

Langkawi International Airport (Tel: +604 955 1311) at Padang Matsirat is about 20km from Kuah and 8km from the beach resort of Pantai Cenang. Langkawi is easily accessible from Malaysia's main gateway, Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA), via the national carrier Malaysia Airlines and Malindo Air, Langkawi is also accessible from the Sultan Abdul Aziz Shah Airport in Subang via Malindo Air and Firefly. The budget carrier Air Asia flies to Langkawi from KLIA2. Langkawi can also be accessed from other parts of the country such as the neighbouring state of Penang (via AirAsia and Firefly) and Kota Bharu on the east coast (via Firefly). Visitors from Singapore can fly in to Langkawi via AirAsia, Silk Air and Tiger Air. AirAsia connects Langkawi to Guangzhou in China.

Mean annual temperature is between 24°C and 33°C. The dry season is from November to March.

Vehicle Rental

Cars can be hired for around RM100 per day depending on the type of vehicle (remember to drive on the left side of the road in Malaysia). Motorcycles and bicycles are easier and cheaper alternatives to discover the island. Motorcycle rental ranges from RM40 per day. You are advised to look out for wildlife crossing while driving. For foreign visitors, an international driving licence is required.
